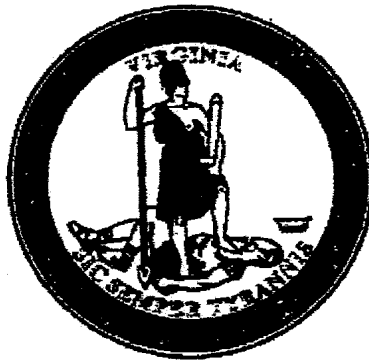

VaDF Regulation 670-1

1. VaDF Regulation 670-1 dated 3 March 2001 is changed effective 8 August 2002. Changes are as follows:
 - a. Insert Page 10A, 10B, and 10C.
 - b. File change sheet not numbered behind coversheet.
2. Synopsis of change:
 - a. Page 10A includes wearing name tapes and grade Velcro rank fasteners on ECWCS parka.
 - b. Page 10B and C prescribe personal appearance while in uniform.
 - c. Provides for wearing of EMT identification badge (Patch) or pin.

Extended Cold Weather Clothing System

The extended cold weather clothing system (ECWCS) is authorized for wear per CTA 50-900. ECWCS has not been fielded to all units.

Composition and classification

6-1 The following are the components of the ECWCS:

Parka, cold weather, camouflage. The parka fabric is a triple layer laminated waterproof, and moisture-vapor permeable nylon material. The garment repels water but is sufficiently porous to prevent moisture buildup from perspiration. The parka has a hood with an attachment piece that allows fastening of the fur ruff, inside map pockets that can be opened without unzipping the parka, two large cargo pockets, and two-way, full front side fasteners to provide full-face protection, leaving only one eye uncovered. The parka is woodland camouflaged and is fully lined with a wind skirt. There are elastic drawcords with barrel locks at the waste and a woven nylon tape drawcord with barrel locks at the hood. Nylon hook and pile fastener tapes are located at the wrist tabs to allow along the full front closure on the overall of the slide fastener, on the windskirt, and the lower front pockets. The Parka is authorized to be worn as an organizational and operational purchase item. When the parka is worn, subdued pin-on insignias of rank will be worn centered on the tab located in the center of the chest.

6-2 **Wearing Name Tapes and Grade Velcro Ranks Fasteners on the Enhanced Cold Weather Clothing System (ECWCS)**

VaDF Personnel are authorized to sew name tapes on the ECWCS parka sleeve pocket flap. The name tape is authorized to be sewn only on the pocket flap of the left sleeve of the ECWCS jacket. The pocket flap will support 13 to 14 one-quarter inch characters/letters.

Insignias of grade embroidered on two-inch webbing with velcro fasteners may be worn on the tab of the parka.

CHAPTER VII Personal Appearance while in Uniform

- 7-1 Body Piercing. No attachments, affixing, or displaying objects, articles, jewelry of ornamentation to or through the skin while in uniform, in civilian clothes while on duty, or in civilian clothes off duty on any military installation or other places under VaDF control.
- 7-2 Tattoos. Visible tattoos or brands on the neck, face or head are prohibited. Tattoos or brands on other areas of the body that are prejudicial to good order and discipline are prohibited. Additionally, any type of tattoo or brand that is visible while wearing a Class A uniform and detracts from a soldierly appearance is prohibited.
- 7-3 Hair and fingernails. Females are authorized to wear lipstick and nail polish with all uniforms as long as the color is conservative. Extreme shades of lipstick and nail polish such as purple, gold, blue and white will not be worn.
- 7-4 Wearing of Jewelry
- a. The wearing of a wrist watch, a wrist identification bracelet, including a conservative style **MIA/POW** identification bracelet (only one item per wrist) and not more than two wrings (wedding set is considered as one wring) is authorized with Army uniform unless prohibited for safety or health reasons as long as the style is conservative and in good taste.
 - b. No jewelry, watch chains, or similar items, to include pens and pencils, will appear exposed on uniforms. Authorized exceptions are a conservative tie tack or tie clasp which may be worn with the black four-in-hand necktie and a pen or pencil which may appear exposed on the hospital duty, food service, CVC, and flight uniform.

b. Female soldiers are authorized optional wear of screw-on, clip-on or post-type earrings with the service, dress, and mess uniform. Earrings will not be worn with class C uniforms (utility, field, or organizational to include hospital duty, food service, and physical fitness uniforms). Earrings will not exceed 6mm or ¼ inch in diameter. They will be of gold, silver, or white pearl, or diamond, unadorned and spherical. When worn, earrings will fit snugly against the ear and will be worn as a matched pair with only one earring per ear lobe. Male soldiers are not authorized to wear any type of earring when in uniform or when wearing civilian clothing on duty.

d. Fad devices, vogue medallions, personal talismans, or Amulets are not authorized for wear in uniform or on duty.

VaDF Regulation 670-1

All current emergency medical technicians may wear the bright Virginia EMT badge (patch) or pin on the left breast pocket of all uniforms to aid both military and civilian personnel in identifying trained emergency medical technicians.

CHAPTER I

Class "C" Utility Uniform (See Appendices A, B, S)

1-1 Authorization for Wear

- a. Authorized for year round wear by all Officers and Enlisted personnel (male or female). OG107 Shirt (blouse) may be worn inside or outside of trousers, at Commander's discretion. Trousers may be unbloused and sleeves rolled up during warm weather. The olive green utility uniform (shade OG 107 & 507) Fatigue and Battle Dress Uniform (BDU) is authorized for all officer and enlisted personnel.
- b. The cold weather field jacket (with/without liner) in OG 107 or BDU is authorized for wear with this uniform in cool weather
- c. BDU Camouflage is authorized. White name tapes with black lettering and a bright VADF shoulder patch on the left shoulder will be worn on all BDU uniforms and field jackets. (Appendix S)
- d. T-shirt (Army brown).

1-2 Occasion for Wear

The Utility Class "C" uniform will be worn while on duty or training status as prescribed by the commander. Duty wear can also mean on special TDY at various ordered occasions, but never while off duty.

1-3 Items worn with or on the utility (Class "C") uniform

- a. Footwear: Black leather combat or jump boots or Jungle Style boot with black, OD. or camouflage canvas uppers.
- b. Gloves: Black leather outer shell with wool insert.
- c. Belt: Black web with black buckle and black tip or Velcro belt without buckle or tip (brass buckle and tip not authorized with this uniform.).
- d. Insignia and accouterments:
 - (1) Collar Insignia: Bright insignia of grade or rank will be worn on the right collar of Officers utility jacket. Militia Branch Insignia for Officers on left collar. (Ref. Appendix N) Enlisted personnel grade/rank worn on both collars. (both O.D. Green and BDU)
 - (2) Shoulder sleeve insignia:
 - (a) Battle Dress Uniform (BDU) - Bright VADF Division Patch worn on left shoulder; bright last active wartime unit insignia on right shoulder.
 - (b) OG 107 Green uniform - subdued VADF Division Patch worn on left shoulder. Last active wartime unit insignia (soldier served with) on right shoulder (subdued).

- (3) Name tapes:
 Soldier's name over the right breast pocket of the utility jacket. Virginia Defense Force tape over left breast pocket of the utility jacket. OG 107 Green uniform tapes are subdued (black letters on olive green background). BDU uniform tapes are bright (black letters on white background).
- (4) Military Police Brassards: when authorized.
- (5) Badges:
 Bright (BDUs) or subdued (OG 107 uniform) type worn on top of left breast pocket of the utility uniform.
- (a) Combat or Expert Infantry Badge
 (b) Airborne or Air Assault Wings
 (c) Aviator or Air Crew Wings
 (d) Others if awarded on active duty service verified by DD 214, NG 22 forms and IAW all applicable Army Regulations governing their wear on a fatigue-type uniform.
- (6) A Brigade-level DUI (Distinctive Unit Insignia or Unit Crest) of the wearer's current brigade may be worn centered ¼" above the soldier's right name tape.
- e. Insignia and accouterments (cold weather field jacket):
- (1) Officers: Bright insignia of rank worn on both shoulder epaulets (OG 107 or BDU)
- (2) Enlisted: Bright insignia of rank worn on both collars (OG 107 or BDU).
- (3) Name and VADF tapes: as described in Para 1-3d (3) for OG 107 or BDU.
- (4) Shoulder patches: as described in Para 1-3d (2).
- (5) Badges: as described in Para 1-3d (5).
- (6) DUI: will be worn on both shoulder epaulets.
- f. Utility Cap (OG 107 or BDU as appropriate): Bright insignia of rank on front of cap.
- g. Rain Gear (authorized for wear with Class "C" Uniform):
- (1) Rubberized/plastic poncho – Olive Drab or Camouflage/Rain Suit
- (2) Raincoat – Black (see Appendix F-2)
- (a) Officers: Bright insignia of rank on both shoulder epaulets
- (b) Enlisted: Bright insignia of rank on both collar lapels
- h. Miscellaneous items for wear with Class "C" Uniform:
- (1) Helmet style for wear by Color/Honor Guards.
- (a) Old-style helmet liners only will be worn without steel "pot" helmet or covers.
- (b) Any color may be worn (black, white, blue, OD, etc.) as long as all are uniform in appearance.
- (c) The Kevlar helmet is not authorized for VADF wear at any time.

- (2) Aviation personnel assigned to elements of the VADF Aviation Bn are authorized to wear a subdued unit patch sewn on the right utility jacket pocket. A full color version may be worn if subdued version is not available.

CHAPTER II

Flight Uniform (See Appendix C)

- 2-1 Authorization for Wear: during flight training exercises, the Olive Drab Flight Uniform is authorized for wear only by Pilots and Air Crew; all other Aviation personnel will wear the Class "C" utility uniform. At any other drills or staff meetings the Flight uniform is not authorized for wear. The Class "C" or modified Class "B" uniform will be worn then as directed by the unit commander.
- 2-2 Items worn with Flight Uniform:
- a. Gloves, flight
 - b. Boots or low quarter shoes, black leather
 - c. Garrison Cap (Army green only) w/edging braid appropriate for wearer's rank (ref. Chapter III, Para 3-1 c)
 - d. Flight Jacket
 - e. Insignia and accouterments worn:
 - (1) Bright insignia of rank
 - (2) Bright insignia of rank and "VA" letters (garrison cap)
 - (3) Bright VADF shoulder patch worn on left sleeve
 - (4) Aviation Battalion DUI over right pocket
 - (5) Wings earned during prior military or civilian service (must have documented proof for wear); or VADF designed wings for a pilot, or other flying air crew member. Worn on leather or cloth name tag over right breast pocket (sewn or attached by Velcro fasteners to uniform).
 - f. T-shirt (Army brown).

CHAPTER III Class "B" Uniform (ref. Appendix D)

- 3-1. Authorization to wear: for year-round wear by all officers and enlisted personnel when authorized by Brigade/Division Commander.
- a. Army green shirt (AG shade 415). Long sleeve always worn with black four-in-hand tie, or short sleeve shirt worn with or without tie.
 - b. Army green trousers (shade 44). Officer's trousers will be with black stripe ornamentation on leg.
 - c. Army green garrison cap (shade 44). Officer cap will have a cord edge braid of gold bullion interwoven with black material. Warrant Officer cap will have silver bullion interwoven with black material. Enlisted personnel will have a cord edge braid of Army green (shade 44).
 - d. White T-shirt, V cut or crew neck.

- 3-2. Occasion for wear: The class "B" Army green uniform may be worn whenever directed/authorized by the Brigade/Division Commander.
- 3-3. Items worn with or on the Class "B" uniform:
- a. On garrison cap:
 - (1) Officer only – bright insignia of rank on left side of cap.
 - (2) Officer and Enlisted – bright brass "VA" initials on right side of cap.
 - (3) Enlisted only – Brigade DUI on left side of cap.
 - b. On the shirt:
 - (1) Shoulder boards - "VA" pin or "VA" embroidered in gold. Officer/Enlisted – embroidered insignia of rank on shoulder boards (Ref. Appendices P & Q)
 - (2) Nametag – red plastic VADF with white sans serif lettering, centered on right pocket flap (Ref. Appendix R).
 - (3) Decorations and ribbons – active duty awards and VADF service worn above left pocket. Prior service awards must be documented by presence in MPRJ (201 file) with a Form DD 214, NG 22 or VADF orders on file at Division HQ.
 - (4) Brigade/Division DUI – may be worn centered over right pocket flap ¼" above pocket edge.
 - c. Footwear: black low quarter shoes with black socks.
 - d. Belt: black web with sliding bright brass buckle and brass tip.
 - e. Black pullover sweater (optional with Army green shirt). Short shoulder boards with "VA" (bright pin or gold embroidered) will be worn with the sweater. The red VADF nametag will be worn on the appropriate place provided on the sweater. Brigade/Division DUI may be worn above the nametag. If no DUI is worn, a bright brass "VA" may be worn.
 - f. Black windbreaker jacket (optional with Army green shirt). Officers - bright insignia of rank will be worn on shoulder epaulets. Enlisted – bright insignia of rank worn on both collars. Ribbed collar jacket - bright insignia of rank will be worn on both shoulder epaulets.

CHAPTER IV Class "A" Uniform (Ref. Appendices E & F)

- 4-1. Authorization to wear. For year-round wear by all officers and enlisted personnel when authorized by Brigade/Division Commander.
- a. Coat: Army green single breasted, peaked lapel, four button. All buttons on coat must have seal of the Commonwealth of Virginia and not the seal of the United States as used by Federally recognized troops. Officer's only – black braid will be worn on cuffs of sleeves.
 - b. Trousers: Army green. Black braid will be worn on legs of officer's trousers.
- 4-2. Occasion for wear: the Class "A" Army green uniform may be worn at informal social or other occasions as authorized by Brigade/Division commander.

- 4-3. Items worn on or with the Class "A" uniform.
- a. Garrison cap – same insignia and braid as described for Class "B" uniform.
 - b. Green Shirt (AG 415) – Long or short sleeve (at Commander's discretion) with black tie and shoulder boards, as described for Class "B" uniform.
 - c. Coat – Officers – Brass "VA" initials on both lapels and Militia insignia pinned below "VA". Enlisted – "VA" initials on a brass disc on the left lapel, and Militia insignia on a brass disc on the right lapel (or "VA" with disc on both lapels, should Militia insignia be unavailable)
 - d. Bright (full color) VADF Division patch – worn on left shoulder.
 - e. Bright last active service wartime unit patch – worn on right shoulder.
 - f. Insignia of rank – Officers – pinned on shoulder epaulets.
 - g. Insignia of rank – Enlisted – sewn on sleeves.
 - h. Brigade/Division DUI – Officer and Enlisted – pinned on shoulder straps.
 - i. Active duty service stripes – Enlisted only – sewn on left sleeve.
 - j. Overseas bars – Officer and Enlisted – sewn on right sleeve.
 - k. Name tag – red plastic VADF with white sans serif lettering, centered on right breast pocket flap. (Ref. Appendix R) A U. S. Army former branch of service regimental crest or VADF DUI of a former unit may be worn centered over right breast pocket.
 - l. Decorations and awards – decoration ribbons and service ribbons, full size, earned on active service as documented by Forms DD 214 or NG 22, also VADF awards and decorations received worn centered over left breast pocket. Ribbons to be worn 1/8 inch above the left breast pocket in as many rows as necessary. Ribbons to be worn in order of precedence from the wearer's right to left. No more than 4 ribbons will be worn in a single row.
 - m. Shoes – black low quarters (with black socks).
 - n. Coat – black all-weather coat with or without liner. Insignia of rank worn on both collar lapels (enlisted) or on each shoulder epaulet (officers).
 - o. Dress Uniform: for formal occasions, a white shirt and bow tie shall be worn in lieu of the green shirt with four-in-hand tie. (Ref. Appendices E-1 & F-1)

CHAPTER V Female personnel uniforms.

- 5-1. Class "C" Utility uniform (Officer and Enlisted Personnel) authorized for year-round wear. (Ref. Appendices B and S)
- a. Olive green uniform (shade OG 107 and 507 fatigues) or BDUs are authorized.
 - b. Accouterments, insignia and patches – same as authorized for male personnel. Refer to Chapter 1.
 - c. Footwear – Black leather combat or jump boots or jungle style boot with black, O.D. or camouflage canvas uppers are authorized.
 - d. T-shirt, Army brown.

- 5-2. Class "B" Army Green Classic Ensemble (Officer and Enlisted Personnel) – worn year round when authorized by the commander (Ref. Appendices G & I).
- a. Shirt AG 415, long and short sleeve. The shirt is of procured durable press, 65/35 polyester/cotton broadcloth. The shirt has a cutaway six button front with shoulder loops. The short sleeve shirt has a convertible collar and may be worn with or without a black neck tab, when this shirt is worn as an outer garment or with authorized accessories (black wind breaker or sweater). When worn with the black sweater without a neck tab, the shirt collar with rank insignia affixed will be worn outside the sweater. The long sleeve shirt will always be worn with a black neck tab. Shoulder boards will be worn with "VA" (either a pin or embroidered in gold) above rank on shirt and sweater.
 - b. Slacks, Army Green pantsuit - the slacks will have straight legs with slightly flared bottoms, self elasticized waist band, a pocket on the right side, and a zipper closure on the left side. Officer's slacks shall have black piping on the legs.
 - c. Headgear – garrison cap Army Green.
 - (1). Officers have cord edge braid of gold bullion with black material intertwined and wear their insignia of rank and "VA" initials on cap.
 - (2). Enlisted personnel will have a cord edge of the same material as the cap, Army green shade 344 and wear their current Brigade/Division DUI and "VA" initials on cap.
 - d. Items normally worn with the Class "B" uniform.
 - (1). Handbag, black clutch type (optional), black service
 - (2). Shoes, oxford, black, or shoes, pumps, black
 - (3). Socks, black (only with slacks)
 - (5) Stockings, sheer
 - e. Skirt, Army Green Classic. The skirt is knee length, slightly flared, with a waistband and zipper closure on the left side.
 - f. Windbreaker jacket, black, as worn by male personnel (Ref. Paragraph 3-3f)
 - g. Insignia, awards, badges and accouterments worn as described in Para 3-3.
- 5-3 Nurses Uniform (Ref. Appendix L)
- a. Basic Uniform - the dress will be worn when prescribed for wear. Dress is white, knee length with short sleeves and a front button closure system, wing tip collars, and a belt.
 - b. Headgear – the female Army green garrison cap w/all insignia and braid as for male personnel or black beret are authorized for wear with the hospital duty uniform when outside the medical facility.
 - c. Footwear – shoes, oxford, white
 - d. Socks – stockings, white
 - e. Insignia and accouterments – bright insignia of branch and rank. Red VADF name tag. Headgear insignia. Decoration/Service ribbons (optional)
 - f. Hospital duty pantsuit (white) is authorized

5-4 Class "A" Uniform (Ref. Appendices J & K)

- a. This uniform will be worn when prescribed by Brigade/Division Commander for dress occasions only.
- b. Either Army green pantsuit or skirt, Army green classic. Pant suit will have no black ornamental braid.
- c. Shirt, AG 415 long or short sleeve. Black neck tab will always be worn with Class "A" uniform.
- d. Headgear – garrison cap, Army green. Piping for officers same as male officers. Enlisted personnel will have cord piping same color as cap. Insignia worn thereon same as for male personnel.
- e. Items worn with Class "A" uniform – same as outlined for males.
- f. Dress Uniform – for formal occasions, a white shirt with black neck tab will be worn in lieu of the green shirt.

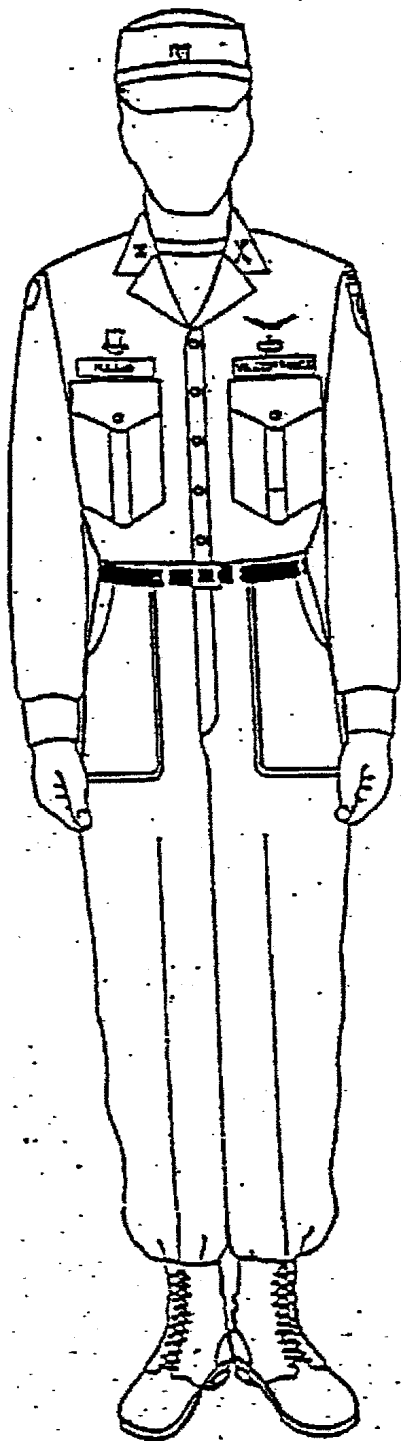

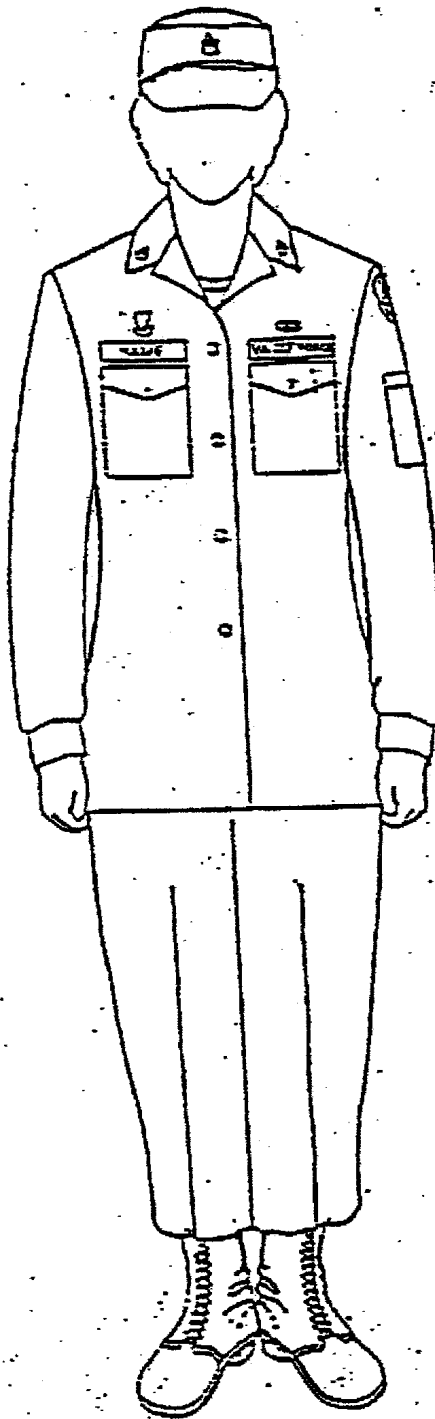

upper pockets

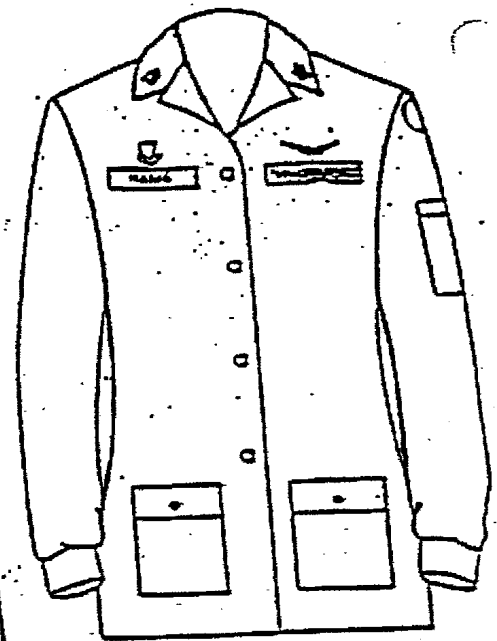
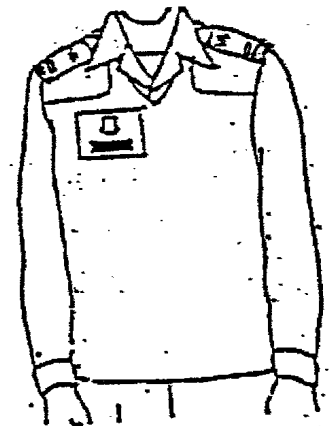
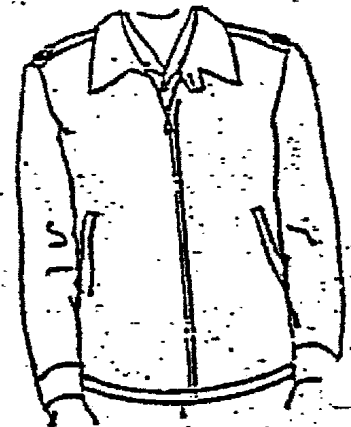


Figure 31-3. OG 107 utility shirt, female,
lower pockets

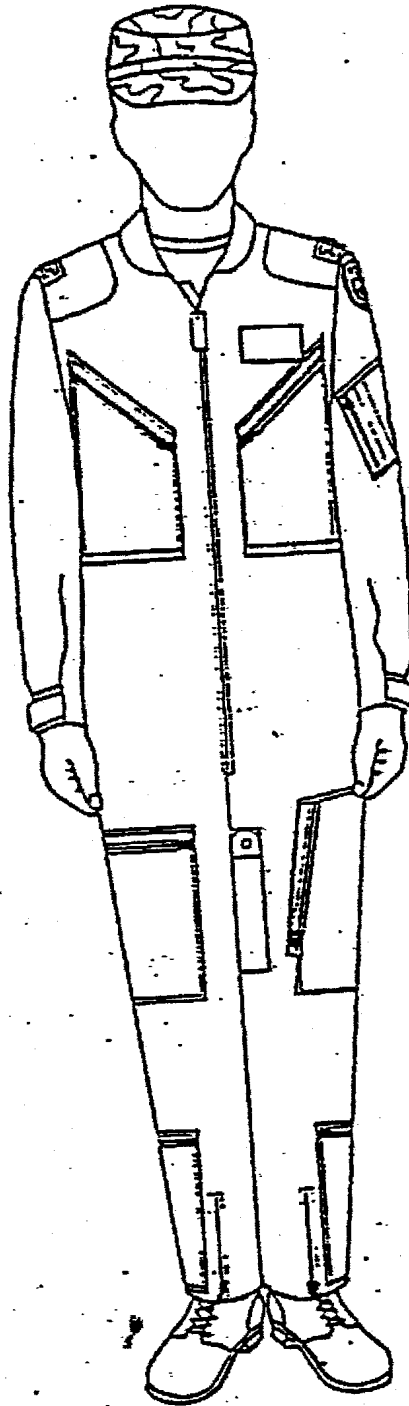


BLACK Sweater, pullover

Hospital duty dress

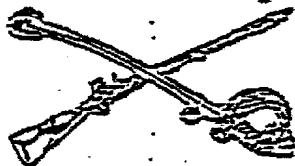


Hospital duty pantsuit

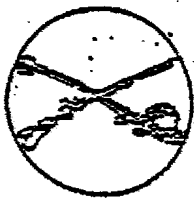
